

This year the ENOS trail features 47 artists in 39 locations. Over two weekends at the end of June, our talented artists, designers and makers invite you into their homes and studios to view and chat with them about their work.

The artist details and maps in this brochure are your guide to our treasure trail, which stretches from Lower Largo to Crail, via Colinsburgh, Kilconquhar, St Monans, Pittenweem, Ardross, Comielaw, and Cellardyke. And look out for our famous red balloons adorning each venue, which along with further details online, will help you to follow the trail from studio to studio.

Our studios include artists who have exhibited internationally, as well as those with an eye on future fame, and every artist has their own unique style. There's always an exciting range of paintings, textiles, prints, jewellery, illustrations, cards, photographs, metalwork and stained glass on sale. If you're looking for something to enhance your home or office, you will find lots of wonderful possibilities as you tour the studios.


ENOS Winter Showcase


My influences are varied from landscapes, seascapes to buildings, I live in Crail and particularly like using found objects from the seashore.


I was born and brought up on the West Shore of Pittenweem and took up painting when I retired.



The Fish Tailor of Pittenweem creates original *gyotaku* fish rubbings and original art work. Incorporating the ancient Japanese method of recording a fisherman's catch using locally caught East Neuk fish.

These images are then reproduced on textiles as linen tea towels, cushions and printed on a co-ordinated range of placemats and coasters. Colours and inspiration are absorbed from the coastline, harbours and beaches around the Fish Tailors studio in Pittenweem, where the technique is perfected.



I graduated with a M.A. Hons in Film and Theatre at Glasgow University in 1991. I then continued at Duncan of Jordanstone College of Art to specialise in stop motion animation. Discovering later that ceramics was my preferred medium, I did some postgraduate ceramics at DJCA followed by two summers' apprenticeship with Lotte Glob, in Durness. I have now been working with clay for over twenty years. From making ceramic jewellery in Mexico, hand thrown pottery in Spain to more abstract work in Scotland.

I now make vessels and figures decorated with coloured slips, melted glass, circular markings and sometimes photographic images. The colours in my glaze decoration are informed by an abstract interpretation of the landscape. I begin by painting the landscape with acrylics on canvas which then inspire the glazing. Goddesses often feature in my work as I play with the idea that they too are responding to our political climate. My work combines abstract design with messages about the world we live in. Sometimes I make colourful animals for fun. I have exhibited in Spain, Mexico and Scotland.
